

We would further wish to underline the lack of consistency between the approach of different rapporteurs on the same theme, that this report exemplifies.

Thus Ms Chanet, the ~~Special~~ ^{of OHCHR} Personal Representative on Cuba recognized the the trade embargo on Cuba has had an adverse impact on the enjoyment of human rights by the Cuban people. When asked why she did not in that case advocate lifting this embargo, Ms Chanet ~~indicated that~~ stated: "It is not within my mandate to make recommendations to states other than Cuba".

However in his report on Belarusia, Mr. Severin, the Special Rapporteur goes exactly in the opposite direction first by actually advocating a trade embargo against Belarus in para. 103 and second by directing a recommendation specifically to other "Member States and in particular Democratic States" to impose such an embargo.

In its efforts at rationalization of mandates of all mandate-holders, the relevant HRC ~~work~~ ^{all} ~~being~~ Inter-governmental Working Group should address such inconsistencies

In conclusion, we urge that ^{all} Special Rapporteurs put emphasis on promoting a spirit of Dialogue and cooperation with countries on which they report ~~to~~ while assist them in addressing ~~the the needed objectives~~ the required human rights objectives. They ^{where possible} should also seek to identify ^{and list} best practice in the areas investigated.
