Report on Human Rights Council Resolution S-1/1 by the Special Rapporteur on the situation of human rights in the Palestinian territories occupied since 1967, Prof. John Dugard

On 6 July 2006 the Human Rights Council resolved to send a fact-finding mission headed by the Special Rapporteur on the Palestinian territories to investigate the situation in Gaza following the commencement of "Operation Summer Rains" by the Israel Defense Forces.

The President of the Human Rights Council requested the consent of the Government of Israel for this mission as required by General Assembly resolution 48/59. Preparations were made for this fact-finding mission but as the Government of Israel failed to give its consent to the mission I was unable to carry out the mission.

I visited the Occupied Palestinian Territory in December 2006 in my capacity as Special Rapporteur on the situation of human rights in the Palestinian territories. On this occasion I made it clear to the Israeli authorities that I was not visiting the region in pursuance of resolution S-1/1 of 6 July 2006 but as Special Rapporteur. The Government of Israel accepted this assurance and facilitated my visit to the OPT despite the fact that it declined to speak to me about the situation in the OPT. Agreatly appreciate the assistance given to me in this way by the Government of Israel.
