INTERVENTION OF THE PERMANENT MISSION OF GEORGIA TO THE UN OFFICE AND OTHER INTENATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS AT GENEVA TO THE REPORT OF THE SPECIAL RAPPORTEUR ON CONTEMPORARY FORMS OF RACISMS, RACIAL DISCRIMINATION, XENOPHOBIA AND RELATED INTOLERANCE

Mr. President,

We fully agree with the conclusions of Special Rapporteur Doudou Diène that current resurgence of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance represents a major threat not only to the rights of the victims, but also to the development of democracy and social cohesion¹.

This phenomenon is deeply disappointing and terrifying when finds translation in the public policies, while the democratic values, human rights and rule of law principles become diminished through disrespect, abuse of power and disgraceful practices.

In this connection, we would like to draw your attention to the cases of persecution and deportation of up to 6 000 citizens of Georgia that took place on massive scale within the Russian Federation for several months since September 2006, accompanied with the infringements upon their fundamental rights, in three cases resulting into the death of the deportees. A discriminatory pattern on ethnic basis was particularly alarming with respect to the attitude taken towards Georgian children in Russia schools and educational institutions.

We highly appreciate the intention of the Special Rapporteur to take measures upon this issue as noted in paragraph 51 of the Report on the Mission to the Russian Federation² and express our readiness for full cooperation with the Special Rapporteur on this matter.
