ORAL STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARIAT IN CONNECTION WITH DRAFT  
RESOLUTION A/HRC/25/L.41 ENTITLED "COMBATING INTOLERANCE,  
NEGATIVE STEREOTYPING AND STIGMATIZATION OF, AND  
DISCRIMINATION, INCITEMENT TO VIOLENCE AND VIOLENCE AGAINST,  
PERSONS BASED ON RELIGION OR BELIEF"

1. This oral statement is made in accordance with rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly.

2. Under the terms of operative paragraph 12 of draft resolution A/HRC/25/L.41, the Human Rights Council would:

- (a) Request the High Commissioner to prepare and submit to the Human Rights Council, at its twenty eighth session, a comprehensive follow-up report with elaborated conclusions based upon information provided by States on the efforts and measures taken by them for the implementation of the action plan outlined in paragraphs 7 and 8 above, as well as their views on potential follow-up measures for further improvement of the implementation of that plan.

3. In order to implement the requests contained in the draft resolution the following activities and resources would be required:

- (a) Conference services for translation and processing of the written report.

4. The activities referred to above relate to section 2, General Assembly and Economic and Social Council Affairs and Conference Management of the programme budget for the biennium 2014-2015.

5. Should the draft resolution be adopted by the Human Rights Council, total requirements of \$35,100 would arise as follows:

6. Accordingly, should the Council adopt draft resolution A/HRC/25/L.41, as orally amended, the related additional requirements of \$35,100 would arise, under section 2, General Assembly and Economic and Social Council Affairs and Conference Management, of the programme budget for the biennium 2014-2015.

7. The total amount of \$35,100, required for implementation of the activities, requested under operative paragraph 29 in the draft resolution, related to section 2, General Assembly and Economic and Social Council Affairs and Conference Management, has not been included under the programme budget for the biennium 2014-2015.

8. These requirements, in accordance with established procedures, would be brought to the attention of the General Assembly, at its 69th session, in the context of the annual report of the Secretary-General on the revised estimates resulting from resolutions and decisions adopted by the Human Rights Council during 2014, in which it would be determined whether some of the additional requirements could be met within the provisions of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 2014-2015. The balance of those additional requirements is to be requested in the context of the contingency fund, established by the General Assembly in its resolutions 41/213 and 42/211.
