- Enhance the system of international protection for refugees, in conformity with Human Rights Law, Refugee Law and International Humanitarian Law;
- Promote the rights of migrants, including through social integration;
- Promote cultural and religious tolerance, and combating racial discrimination and xenophobia;
- Promote democracy, rule of law and good governance at all levels;
- Work towards the full realization of the right to development and poverty eradication;
- Enhance South-South cooperation through innovative instruments.

As a member of the African, Arab and Islamic worlds, and as a strong advocate for international and regional peace and security, support for Egypt's election to the Human Rights Council will provide added impetus to the promotion of human rights and fundamental freedoms as an integral part of the ongoing reform efforts in Egypt and the extensive Egyptian efforts in this regard at the regional and international levels.
